Preparing for the "Making VT Visible" PR Campaign

It's time to prepare for the annual Vision and Learning Campaign! Beginning

in June and running through the month of August, we focus on promoting August as Vision and Learning Month. In order to best utilize the testimonials, promotions and press releases that will be coming out, I wanted to give you a short 'action plan' to help you take advantage of this material.

1. Schedule a Free Lecture

First, it is important that you offer a free service of some sort to get media attention for a monthly observance. While free vision screenings are good, I would recommend you schedule a free community lecture. You can take the COVD press release, add your practice information to it and invite parents and educators to your free community lecture. Watch for the COVD email blast with the press release and further instructions.

When: Free community lectures are always good to schedule towards the middle to the end of the month of August. This will maximize the time you have to promote it. Because it is free, it gives you the ability to get information to your local book store (if you have one), children's stores, toy stores, local news, YWCA, etc., basically wherever parents will see it. Most parenting magazines have an online community events calendar where you can post your free lecture. You can also promote it through social media. **Promote:** Create a flier for your talk and have it handed out to all your vision therapy patients and their parents; and ask for their help in spreading the word. In addition, if you have a primary eye care practice, it should be handed out to all your primary care patients at checkout. If you have email addresses for your patients it can also be sent through an email service such as Solution Reach, Demand Force, Web Systems 3, Constant Contact, etc.

2. Get Success Stories from Parents Who Are Willing to Speak with the Media

If you can gather a few parents who would like to help spread the word about vision therapy and want to speak with the media, then you can add a cover note to your press release when you send it out stating that you have a sample of local parents they can interview. You can also invite these parents to speak at your free community lecture, a live testimonial has a lot of impact!

3. Send the COVD Press Release to Your Local Media

Keep an eye out for the COVD email blasts with the press releases. There will be one issued at the beginning of June, July and August. If for any reason you don't see them, you can check the COVD Press Release page or email the COVD International Office at info@covd.org.

Customize the release with your information (a sample is located in the members only section) and then send it out to all your local media, etc. *(continued)* E-VISIONS QUARTERLY

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4. Prepare Your Front Desk Staff to Answer Calls


Brief your staff about the upcoming free lecture, and instruct them on who they should invite. For example, if a patient calls and schedules an appointment in the office which will be prior to the workshop, they will get all the info when they come into the office. However, the potential new patient who doesn't schedule an appointment would be the perfect person to invite. Update them on the COVD 'Making VT Visible' Campaign – have them visit COVD's website so they can see the wealth of information and all the press releases. This will help them see the bigger picture, beyond your office.
